New Legislative Threat Introduced in Wisconsin Red Light Ticket Cameras

AB 827, a bill to legalize red light ticket cameras in Wisconsin was introduced in the State Assembly on March 9th by Reps. Steinbrink, Soletski, Black and Berceau; cosponsored by Senator Wirch.

Act 466, the bill we fought so hard for, that allows motorcycles to proceed through a red light when a vehicle actuated signal does not recognize their presence would effectively be useless if the same intersection is equipped with red light ticket cameras. You would receive a ticket in the mail for obeying the law and it would then be up to you to go to court to defend yourself, or pay the \$50 plus costs fine.

Studies of the effectiveness of these cameras at reducing crashes at intersections have shown that, contrary to the vendor's claim of improved safety, crashes of all types increase at camera monitored intersections. Many times the vendor or the unit of government receiving the money form the fines will shorten the length of the yellow lights to less than the federal mandated minimum times to maximize the revenue that can be generated from the motoring public. The vendor also gets a portion of the revenue from every ticket sent out
