Brothers and Sisters Lost

July 6th the motorcycle community lost a great friend. Floyd B. "Chappy" Serns, 54, Stevens Point, died as a result of a onevehicle accident in Marathon County.

During the Memorial service July 12th, Lorie and I accompanied by 14 other Patriot Guard Riders stood in honor of this man of big size and heart at Boston Funeral Home in Stevens Point, WI. While listening during the service all the people that revisited past memories involving "Chappy" seemed to be easily seen in the minds of all. He was just the kind of person you would want on your side in just about any situation.

Some of his contributions were fund-raising for our troops, the community, friends and fellow bikers. Floyd always seemed to be involved. He had always been active in veterans' rights and had been an honorary member of many groups including Vets 5/50 and Vietnam Veterans of America. He helped fund-raise for the High Ground in Neillsville. He was a consistent supporter of veterans from past wars, volunteering many hours, and sometimes days. Floyd then threw himself into his passion as a supporter of the U.S. troops in the Iraqi Conflict, working as an Honorary Guard of the Patriot Freedom Riders. He led the organizing of fund-raisers for Fisher House, an organization which provides housing for the families of injured troops in the state. He served as secretary of "Rugger Warrior Fund," an organization which sends care packages to UWSP rugby players and their families serving in Iraq.
