The Fisher House Foundation now has 62 Fisher Houses located on or near military installations and military hospitals all over the US and Europe. These homes enable family members to be close to a loved one at the most stressful times during the hospitalization for an unexpected illness, disease, or injury. All at no cost to the families.

The Crimson Crusaders have been collecting supplies for the Fort Bragg Fisher House for some time, and will be delivering them on Saturday June 21st with a motorcycle escort.

I arrived at the Landmark Baptist Church at about 8:30. There was already a small crowd of bikers. I was greeted with warm smiles as I approached the group. I knew a few but they are all friends now. We talked, and laughed about a lot of things, and then went in to eat a great breakfast. I watched as the food was being prepared. As we sat at our tables, a lady from the Fort Bragg Fisher House gave a talk with a slide presentation about what the house means to the military personnel and their families. She was in tears during her talk.

After she finished her speech, there was a steady line of people dropping money into the large donation jars. It was a moving presentation. Many of the bikers present were veterans, and wanted to help. I know that I did.

I said my good-bys, and headed home about 9:30. I had a good feeling like I helped make a difference. That's what charity does. It helps those who are in need, and those who give.












