
While I've been down I've been designing bikes and really love it. I love it so much that I started saving by Little Debbie Boxes and made bikes out of them!

ART OF THE CHOPPER

Tom Zimberoff's recent book Art of the Chopper is absolutely the best picture book I have ever seen on the on the subject of customized American motorcycles. The author and everyone connected with this project should be commended for their professionalism and attention to detail and the excellence of the photographs of both the people and beautiful machines presented in this new hardback.

I am fond of stripped-down bare bones motorcycles but I rarely see the type of iron I like on the pages of published materials. In this book, however, Zimberoff displays what the grass roots chopper styling of the 60's and 70's has morphed into today. Most are of motorcycles featured are of the throwback design built in the minimalist style of the "Old Skool" days. In Art of the Chopper, They're all there; the long bikes, raked-out lean choppers, bobbers, and race inspired chop jobs.

Like a rare classic automobile a custom chopper is also seen as a form of sculptured art. Though in spite of this, motorcycles and especially choppers represent rebellion. Many times artists are rebels and these rebels present their finished work as if to say "This is who I am and this is what I can do." The photographs and biography's of 20 top designer-builders embellish the 256 large pages of this coffee-table style book. Several pages of each highlighted fabricator's completed creations are shown. All of the many bikes featured in the book are printed in radiant color. The author, Tom Zimberoff, through his photography and text makes evident the culture and philosophy of chopper art and the love these twenty builders have for their machines.
