



THE GIFT

Remember when? When I was a kid, I looked forward to getting gifts for my birth-day, and for Christmas. I don't exactly know when it happened, but somewhere along the line, I began to take those gifts for granted. I would think, "My birthday's coming up, so I wonder what I'm going to get this year?" Or, "I can hardly wait to see all the stuff I'm going to get for Christmas." I also remember those occasions when grandma might say, "Have you been a good boy this year, so Santa can bring you A neat gift?" I grew up with that idea of deserving to get a gift because it was my birthday, or because I had been good. I was also threatened with the thought that if I didn't do good, or measure up in some way, that I would forfeit my right to get the gift.

Fast forward to the present. I got a phone call the other day, informing me that I had won a free gift. All I had to do was to pay a \$99 registration charge, and I would receive my gift certificate for a free vacation in the mail. As I was walking through the mall awhile back, I stopped in front of the department store where I could get a free gift if I would just sign up for their new credit card. I see free offers and great gifts offered all the time on the internet, if I will just complete a survey, or send in a doodad with my registration fee. How about the message I get from the religious powers that be? If I get my hair cut and put on a suit and tie, I will be acceptable to God. If I give enough money in the offering, or attend enough services, or do enough good works, God will give me gifts - blessings, heaven when I die, fewer problems, etc.

It's no wonder that people are all screwed up about how to live that ideal life. We get so many mixed messages about what we are supposed to do, that we don't even know what a REAL gift is. We live in a performance oriented world, and we have no idea what really matters anymore. What if I told you that God isn't interested in OUR performance? What if I said that God's gift to us is not conditioned on what we do or don't do? Could you possibly believe that? That isn't the message conveyed by most religious people. Even those everyday people we know and love, who occupy the pews on Sunday, are confused about what God wants from us. The question of performance was answered long ago, when the overwhelming conclusion was that we cannot perform up to God's expectations, because of sin. The Apostle Paul wrote, "The wages paid for sin is death; but the GIFT of God is Eternal Life through Jesus Christ the Lord." (Romans 6:23) God is not interested in giving us what we have earned, but in giving us a free gift. Jesus died on the cross and rose from the grave, earning new life for us. This is a free gift to us, paid for by the Son of God, Jesus.
