

In case you're not familiar with Rolling Thunder, it is a protest that was organized over twenty years ago to ensure that our soldiers would never be left behind in a foreign country again. I personally believe that the hard work of the organizers of this event and the hundreds of thousands of bikers that show up have had a direct effect on this nations policy on MIA's. One only needs to know of the only three MIA's in Iraq to understand that these bikers have made a difference. I would consider them all patriots, and I'll always be proud to participate in this ride.

Everyone close to me knows about the death of my good friend Jon in a right of way violation crash in September of 07. Anyone that has experienced this type of loss can understand the anger and helplessness I felt over the situation. Like many right of way crashes involving motorcycles Jons killer received a slap on the wrist even after my repeated efforts informing law enforcement and the courts of the enhanced penalties Act 466 gave them. ABATE of WI is making great efforts to make sure that right of way offenders get the punishment that they deserve and we are currently lobbying for a correction to that bill to make sure irresponsible drivers are punished. Until then, if these cases actually start making it to court, we'll need all the help we can get filling the court-rooms with outraged bikers. Take the time to reach out to law enforcement in your area and inform them of the now not so new law (it was passed in 2006). With perseverance we will be able to change the way the public views motorcycle crashes.

If you're not familiar with ABATE of WI, next time you see someone wearing ABATE clothing go up and ask what we're about, we won't bite. When we're not having fun we've got our heads buried in legislative and safety issues and help the politically motivated motorcyclist preserve the freedoms we enjoy. ABATE of WI is not a club, is not limited to HD riders, and is about a lot more than just helmet laws. This year we've sent our legislative team to Madison to lobby for motorcycle safety funds in the state budget and to promote our enhanced penalties for irresponsible inattentive drivers that kill and injure motorcyclists. We also are the main provider of motorcycle awareness information in Wisconsin.
