Lorie and I attended the hearing in Fond Du Lac June 15th along with 50 or so other riders that were there to show their support to the families of the riders. Well behaved and polite riders taking time off their jobs and out of their day for support. Afterwards we headed to the site of the incident as a way for us to say a silent prayer and to reflect.

I put out on my face book page, " I am asking for thoughts of what happened after the crash. pertaining to the charitable aspect, the out pouring of prayers and help to the families. What does this mean to you as a biker?

Dwayne Bargenquast, "I'm so proud of how we all came together in this tragic time. The motorcycle community are an awesome group of people." Penny S., "I had asked the people I work with to pray for these brothers and the families affected by this." " It's been just amazing to see how the general public responded in comparison to the brothers and sisters in the wind. Who by one common thread have pulled together to support the bikers and their families involved in this tragedy. It means a lot to know that I belong to a community that not only does so much for charities, but each other as well."

With many in the general public having the perception of motorcyclists in general as bad guys, thugs and usually up to no good as portrayed in the show "Son's of Anarchy", the real life happenings in the biker com
