It is a good idea to update your bike's electrical system. Original is nice but riding an older machine at night is like trying to see by the light of a match. The conversion to 12-volt is pretty straightforward. You will need to buy a 12-volt battery and late model oil tank to house it in to keep your stock look. You will have to replace your points, coil, spark plugs, and plug wires. You will also have to replace your fuses with 12-volt components. You will need to change your generator, regulator, coil, and all of your lights. The cost will be about \$400 to \$700 depending on whether, or not, you use new or used parts.

I would really like to have a Harley-Davidson someday. My financial situation right now does not permit it. I have a Honda Shadow. Could I put a Harley motor in it? What changes to the frame are involved and what do you think it would cost?

You would need to rebuild the entire frame on your Honda and strengthen all the weld joints to accommodate the V-twins additional size and torque.
