
Safety tips

**Ride trained/Ride licensed – Getting motorcycle rider training is of great value to beginners and experienced riders to learn about motorcycle operation and how to reduce the risks of riding a motorcycle. Information about motorcycle training is available through the Ohio Department of Public Safety's Motorcycle Ohio office at 1-800-83-RIDER, or on the Web at www.motorcycle.ohio.gov, or at select motorcycle dealerships.

**Ride sober – Riding a motorcycle takes coordination, balance, and good judgment. In 2005, approximately 50 percent of all Ohio fatal crashes in which a motorcycle rider was at fault were alcohol-related. **Troopers are stressing the importance of drivers being aware of motorcyclists. Other vehicle drivers were in error in nearly 48 percent of the 2005 motorcyclist fatalities in Ohio. When driving, please be aware of motorcyclists by taking extra precautions when changing lanes, checking blind spots, taking extra time and paying attention at intersections
