CONTEST RULES

1. START Mileage Readings may be taken any time on or after contest starts on April 1 (as above).
2. END Mileage Readings may be taken any time after the April 1 Contest Start up to the Nov 1 Contest End (as above).
3. Mileage Readings must be done in person at Classic Cycle on registered motorcycle(s) to be officially recorded.
4. A Mileage Reading must note five things: Rider's name, date, plate number, make or model bike, and of course the mileage indicated on the odometer.
5. All Mileage Reading records will be kept by Classic Cycle.
6. Each Rider is credited with the actual mileage between START and END readings of the odometer of his bike(s).
7. If you change bikes during the season, be sure to come to Classic Cycle to register the readings (end on the old bike, start on the new bike) as noted above.

Note: Usually, in other mileage contests, it's typical that someone goes over the 10,000 mile mark, but in many cases, the high mileage winners were missing in action or just plain didn't ride much. (We've heard of contests that were won with less than 4,000 miles!) So please don't think you don't have a chance!

Judges decisions are final and non-negotiable!
