We all got to the Little River Inn just about dusk and as we passed by his casket each of us appropriately saluted him with a handful of throttle. He was then returned to the funeral

home. The next day a Pig Roast was held in his honor that lasted late into the evening with many stories and remembrances about the large man with the big heart that we all knew simply as "Big John". Rest in Peace Brother ... You will be missed.
